


Overview

Derived from the word 'Bidru', the name of the district has been based on the bamboo clusters that have grown here in the past. Bidar is known for its archaeological heritage, mainly in the district capital. The district in itself is home to 61 monuments, out of which 31 are located in and around Bidar City, earning it the name of "The City of Whispering Monuments".

 Mantapa are the main tourist attractions





Economy

- ► GDDP is INR 13, 536 Crore in the year 2014 -15 (at Current Prices)
- Urbanization in the district is 25% compared to 39% in the state
- Bidar devotes over 60% of its land for cultivation; with a major focus on Sugarcane, Jawar, Bajra, Pulses, Ginger, Sunflower and Soyabean
- Bidar has a focus on agriculture and allied products, followed by manufacturing, construction and mining industries.

District Per capita Income (in INR)*







- Area sown more than once: 55,248 Ha





- ▶ 84 factories in the district










Bidar Fort


